ITALIAN SPARROW PASSER DOMESTICUS ITALIAE KLEPTOPARASITIZED GREAT TIT PARUS MAJOR

On the 11th of February 1984 at 9.00 a.m. in the WWF Natural Oasis "Bosco di Palo" 40 km North of Rome, I watched a single Great tit *Parus major* which, after catching a sunflower seed from an artificial manger near a building, perched on a near by tree, and holding the seed with its claws, pecked it in order to open it. A female Italian Sparrow *Passer domesticus italiae*, having observed everything, attacked the Great Tit, frightened it away and made off the already opened seed.

This behaviour may be described, using Brockman & Barnard's words (cf. their study of the categories of parasitic behaviours, 1979), as: "parasitic bird dives at host from above and picks up food dropped by host". Passer domesticus is a species with remarkably aggressive tendencies particularly in the female (Johnston 1969). Brockman & Barnard (1979) described cases of kleptoparasitism against other species (even arthropods) but not against the Great Tit.

On several subsequent occasions, I watched the Great Tit and the Italian Sparrow eating together on the same manger without signs of aggression; moreover the Italian Sparrow knows how to open sunflower seeds skillfully, though using a different technique from that of the Great Tit. So my observation has to be considered as an exception.

RIASSUNTO

UNA PASSERA D'ITALIA PASSER DOMESTICUS ITALIAE CLEPTOPARASSITIZZA UNA CINCIALLEGRA PARUS MAJOR.

Viene descritto un caso eccezionale di cleptoparassitismo tra Passera d'Italia e Cinciallegra.

UN MOINEAU CISALPIN PASSER DOMESTICUS ITALIAE CLEPTOPARASSITIZE UNE MESANGE CHARBONNIERE.

On décrit un cas exceptionnel de cléptoparassitisme d'un Moineau cisalpin à l'égard d'une Mésange charbonnière.
